Holy Week & Easter Sunday 2021

How wonderful it was to celebrate Holy Week and Easter Sunday in a public way! If you recall, for Holy Week and Easter Sunday of 2020, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts was under a complete lockdown due to the COVID 19 pandemic. The attendance for Holy Week was truly inspiring. The Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Liturgies were also very well attended. I hope and pray that as we move forward with more vaccinations taking place, attendance will continue to increase. The Bishop continues to offer the “dispensation” for Catholics who are not quite ready to return to Sunday Mass for their spiritual benefit. In other words, there is no need to confess missing Mass on Sunday due to the pandemic. It is most important that all attendees at Sunday Mass are comfortable with being in a “public gathering” especially if an individual has other underlying health issues.

Financial Support

Throughout the pandemic the financial support of the parish has been and continues to be amazing. Though the income has declined somewhat, the financial support has allowed the parish to meet all recurring expenses. The most difficult reality financially, has been the loss of Bingo revenue. Bingo revenue supports St. Joan of Arc School and assists the parish to offer school tuition subsidy. Since the lockdown occurred in March 2020, the parish has maintained its commitment to meet its financial obligation for tuition assistance to school members of the parish. Though the parish cannot afford to permanently pay the tuition subsidy without Bingo revenue, the parish will reconsider this every year, or until Bingo can resume.

Reminders for COVID 19 protocols while in church

- Hand sanitizing stations are available at all entrances to the church – please avail yourself to them.
- Maintain “social distance” throughout the Mass.
- Facial masks are required to enter the church and must be worn throughout the Mass.
- Facial masks must always cover both your mouth and nostrils.


- For the reception of Holy Communion, the facial mask must be covering both the nostrils and mouth while extending the hands for the Eucharist. Then step to the side and remove half the mask to consume the Sacred Host, and then replace the mask to full position.
- The reception of Holy Communion will continue to take place in the “new normal” of after the dismissal until it is safe to do otherwise. The “new normal” facilitates the egress from the church with social distancing. The exception is at the Liturgy of Christian Burial and a few special Masses such as a Nuptial Mass, First Communion, and Confirmation.
- Missalettes and bulletins are still “off limits” to be used and distributed.
- The “Sunday Offering” process will continue to be observed ever since the return to public worship: please place the offering in the “collection baskets” located in front of the last pews as you enter the church. This method allows all persons to be socially distanced throughout the Mass – not putting the usher and the congregant in too close of a proximity.

By maintaining the above-mentioned protocol, Mass at Ste. Rose can continue to be a safe place to gather for the celebration of Sunday Mass. Perhaps other parishes may have “relaxed” a few protocol procedures, it is best to err on the side of caution than to become too relaxed and become a less safe place for public worship.

The History of Divine Mercy Sunday

The Octave, or eighth day, of Easter has always been considered special by Christians. Christ, after His Resurrection, revealed Himself to His disciples, but Saint Thomas wasn't with them. He declared that he would never believe that Christ had risen from the dead until he could see Him in the flesh and probe Christ's wounds with his own hands. This earned him the name "Doubting Thomas."

A week after Christ rose from the dead, He appeared once again to His disciples, and this time Thomas was there. His doubt was vanquished, and he professed His belief in Christ.

Nineteen centuries later, Christ appeared to a Polish nun, Sr. Maria Faustina Kowalska, in a series of visions that took place over almost eight years. Among those visions, Christ revealed the Divine Mercy Novena, which He asked Sister Faustina to pray for nine days, beginning on Good Friday. That meant that the novena ended on the Saturday after Easter — the eve of the Octave of Easter. Thus, since novenas are commonly prayed in advance of a feast, the Feast of Divine Mercy — Divine Mercy Sunday — was born.

Indulgences for Divine Mercy Sunday

A plenary indulgence (the forgiveness of all temporal punishment resulting from sins that have already been confessed) is granted on the Feast of Divine Mercy to all the faithful who go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and "in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honour of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. 'Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!')."

A partial indulgence (the remission of some temporal punishment from sin) is granted to the faithful "who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation."
